1 Introduction

The Classical Republican Party (CRP) of Australia is committed to the principles of natural law, individual liberty, civic virtue, limited government, moral and social order, constitutional originalism, national sovereignty, and the rejection of cronyism and supranational control.

This Donor Code of Conduct ensures that all donations align with these foundational values while promoting transparency, preventing foreign influence, and supporting genuine free enterprise and rights advocacy. The rules balance the need for party funding with the protection of Australian sovereignty and individual freedoms.

Donations are voluntary and greatly appreciated to support website maintenance, communication campaigns, and party activities. Membership remains free.

2 Core Donor Rules

2.1 1. Absolute Ban on Foreign Influence

No donations shall be accepted from:

- Foreign governments, foreign companies, or foreign principals.
- Any entity where more than 10% ownership or control is held by non-Australian citizens or foreign-linked organisations.
- Shell companies, trusts, or vehicles designed to obscure foreign ties.

This rule upholds the Party's commitment to **national sovereignty** and Australian self-determination.

2.2 2. Rights Advocacy Groups Explicitly Welcomed

Australian rights-advocacy organisations **and rights-advocacy groups from other countries with similar interests and aligned principles** are encouraged to donate. This includes groups focused on:

- Civil liberties and constitutional rights.
- Self-defence and responsible firearm ownership, including rural firearm ownership.
- Farm rights and rural interests.
- Patient informed consent and protection from coercive practices.
- Cryptocurrency enthusiasts and financial sovereignty advocates.

- Other interested parties aligned with natural rights, individual liberty, and classical republican principles.

No additional caps or scrutiny apply beyond standard disclosure requirements. These groups advance the Party’s mission of protecting natural rights and individual liberty.

2.3 3. Domestic Corporate and Organisational Donors

Australian-registered companies and domestic trade groups may donate provided they operate primarily in Australia and align with CRP principles of free enterprise, innovation, and local decision-making.

Priority support is given to:

- Local and domestic manufacturing, including firearms and defence-related industries (consistent with the right to self-defence).
- Genuine pharmaceutical and medical innovators developing effective, evidence-based treatments for physical and organic conditions (e.g., drugs that treat encephalitis or similar diseases).

Restrictions apply to:

- Companies whose primary business involves psychiatric pharmaceuticals or coercive “biological psychiatry” practices that conflict with the Party’s emphasis on community-based care, liberty, and natural moral order.

2.4 4. Strict Contribution Limits (No Special Treatment)

- Maximum donation: \$100,000 per entity per financial year (corporate or organisational).
- No bundling through related entities to exceed the limit.
- All donors are treated equally regardless of donation size. No policy promises, special access, or guaranteed meetings shall be offered.

This prevents cronyism and ensures limited government principles are upheld.

2.5 5. Full Public Disclosure (Sunlight Rule)

- Every donation greater than \$1,000 must be published on the CRP website within 7 days, including: donor name, amount, date, and a brief description of the donor’s business or purpose.
- Donations greater than \$10,000 shall be disclosed in real time.
- An annual summary of all donations shall be published and submitted to the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) in full compliance with Australian law, exceeding minimum requirements where possible.

Transparency is essential to maintain public trust and constitutional integrity.

2.6 6. Independent Ethics and Alignment Review

All donations of \$25,000 or more shall be reviewed by a small independent CRP Ethics Committee (3–5 rotating members with no donor influence). The review shall confirm alignment with natural law, limited government, sovereignty, and liberty principles.

The decision and reasoning shall be published alongside the disclosure. Rejection of a donation is final.

2.7 7. Enforcement and Annual Review

- Any violation results in immediate return of funds and a public statement.
- These rules shall be reviewed annually at the Party conference to ensure they continue serving the principles of justice, liberty, and long-term national stability without unnecessary bureaucracy.

3 Alignment with CRP Principles

These rules are grounded in the Classical Republican Party's core values:

- **National Sovereignty** — Rejecting foreign influence.
- **Liberty and Dignity** — Protecting natural rights and free enterprise.
- **Limited Government** — Avoiding cronyism and special treatment.
- **Moral and Social Order** — Supporting ethical innovation and community-based approaches (e.g., evidence-based medicine over coercive practices).
- **Constitutional Originalism** — Maintaining transparency and accountability.

By adopting this Donor Code, the CRP demonstrates a faithful return to the principles that animated Australia's Federation of 1901.
