CHAPTER 1

INTRODUCTION TO CRP

The CRP formally (NORPA), founded in 2025, is a political movement dedicated to restoring fundamental rights and freedoms to Australian citizens. CHAPTER 2

CORE VALUES OF CRP

2.1 CONSTITUTIONAL ORIGINALISM

Constitutional originalism is the cornerstone of CRP legal philosophy. This principle holds that the Australian Constitution should be interpreted according to its original public meaning at the time of ratification, ensuring that the document's intent remains unaltered by modern judicial activism. By adhering to originalism, CRP aims to protect the separation of powers, prevent the erosion of individual liberties, and maintain the federal structure as envisioned by the framers.

2.2 LIBERTY, DIGNITY, AND PURPOSE

At the heart of CRP ethos are the intertwined values of liberty, dignity, and purpose. **Liberty** represents the freedom of individuals to pursue their lives without undue interference, grounded in natural rights. **Dignity** affirms the inherent worth of every person. **Purpose** encourages a life of meaning through family, community, and voluntary associations. Together, these values empower Australians to build fulfilling lives and strengthen the social fabric.

2.3 TRANSPARENCY, DUE PROCESS, COLOUR OF LAW PROTECTION, AND FULL DOUBLE JEOPARDY

CRP champions robust safeguards for justice: open government, fair legal procedures, prevention of abuses of authority, and strict double jeopardy protections that bar retrials for the same offence.

2.4 REJECTION OF UN AND EU CONTROL

CRP firmly rejects supranational overreach from organizations like the United Nations and European Union, prioritizing full Australian sovereignty and self-determination.

2.5 RURAL AUSTRIAN ECONOMIC MODEL (REJECTING RESERVE BANKING)

CRP advocates a decentralized, sound-money economy based on Austrian economic principles and rural self-sufficiency, rejecting debt-based central banking and fiat reserve systems.

2.6 GOVERNANCE: CHECKS AND BALANCES, CAPABLE MILITARY

Strict separation of powers, federalism, and a strong, defensively oriented military form the backbone of CRP vision for stable and secure governance.

2.7 FREEDOM OF RELIGION, GUARANTEED FIREARM OWNERSHIP, CASTLE DOCTRINE, AND STAND YOUR GROUND

Absolute freedom of religious practice, constitutionally guaranteed firearm ownership for self-defence, castle doctrine, and stand-your-ground laws are non-negotiable natural rights under CRP.

2.8 PRESERVATION OF THE FEDERAL COMPACT

The 1901 federal compact between the States and Commonwealth is sacred and must be restored to its original balance, with the Commonwealth strictly limited to its enumerated powers.

2.9 VOLUNTARY VOTING

Compulsory voting is an infringement on liberty. CRP supports fully voluntary voting to encourage informed, voluntary civic participation.

2.10 EDUCATION: TRUTH IN SCHOOLING AND MANDATORY CONSTITUTIONAL LITERACY

School curricula must teach objective truth and historical accuracy. Every Australian student will be required to achieve genuine constitutional literacy to understand and defend their rights and system of government.

CHAPTER 3

CONCLUSION

The core values of the Classical Republican Party formally (NORPA) are not a radical departure from Australia's founding vision; rather, they represent a faithful return to the principles that animated the Federation of 1901.

The framers of the Australian Constitution deliberately crafted a federal compact that dispersed power between the Commonwealth and the States, enshrined limited government, protected fundamental freedoms (including arms-bearing rights inherited from British common law), and rejected the concentration of authority that had characterised colonial rule. They created a system grounded in the rule of law, separation of powers, and the sovereignty of the people—ideas drawn from both the classical liberal tradition and the British constitutional heritage.

- Constitutional originalism was the only method of interpretation contemplated in 1901.
- Liberty, dignity, and the pursuit of a meaningful life were seen as the natural fruits of responsible self-government.
- The rejection of foreign entanglements echoes the fierce independence of the colonies as they united on their own terms.
- The Austrian/rural economic vision aligns with the free-trade, sound-money, and agrarian ideals dominant at Federation.
- Strong checks and balances, a citizenry capable of self-defence, and robust state autonomy were explicit features of the 1901 settlement.
- Even voluntary voting reflects the original liberal spirit—compulsion was a later addition opposed by many at the time.

In short, CRP does not seek to invent a new Australia, but to restore the old one—the Australia of 1901 where government was the servant of a free, dignified, and purposeful people. By recommitting to these proven founding principles, CRP offers a clear pathway back to the liberty, sovereignty, and prosperity that our Federation was designed to secure.
